In order to show support for our local Veterans ahead of Remembrance Day residents are invited to contribute to the poppy campaign and wear a poppy.

Wayne Bird, the Selkirk Legion's Poppy Officer, says that this is a cam-

paigned that has been put on by the Legion for many years.

"It's a way that we can raise funds to help Veterans and the whole community. A lot of times we help buy stuff at hospitals or nursing homes that we need, not only for the vets but community members as well," he said.

Donations collected during the Poppy Campaign are held in Trust at the branch level to directly support Veterans and their families within their

City of Selkirk looking for Fair Trade volunteers

Many Fair Trade options are available in our community

Selkirk's Fair Trade Committee is a great local resource to learn more about Fair Trade and how residents can incorporate more Fair Trade options into their lives. With October being Fair Trade Month they welcome residents to learn more and possibly volunteer with the group.

"[A Fair Trade Town's] purpose is to unite the local population by providing global Fair Trade opportunities for purchasing ethical and sustainable choices," said Megan Lamirande, Program Coordinator for the City of Selkirk.

Selkirk became a Fair Trade Town in 2017. This designation is earned by meeting requirements such as a certain amount of Fair Trade certified products available at local businesses, hosting public awareness events, and having a steering committee that has active meetings with community volunteers and leadership members.

Overall, the goal is to contribute to

sustainable development by offering better trading conditions to and securing the rights of, marginalized producers and workers.

Because of the pandemic, the Selkirk Fair Trade Committee, which the city is a part of, had hit a bit of a lull, but with life returning to a more in-person experience, the committee is back and is ready for new members to join in.

"We're looking for individuals that have various interests, but in general, they would ideally be interested in promoting Fair Trade within Selkirk. We need someone to assist with planning events and promotions. We would need someone to assist with providing education either to the local businesses that might not be a part of it yet or perhaps visiting, say, the elementary schools or one of the centers like the Friendship Center or Gordon Howard, just to give information on how certain Fair Trade products can benefit them. As well, individuals

that want to help working at events or at our tables in the summer. We usually have a table up for Holiday Alley serving hot chocolate. So, [we're just looking for] volunteers that want to help out with support that way, hopefully, we can grow the committee and create new roles," said Lamirande.

The Committee currently gets together about once a month and the time commitment that would be required from volunteers would depend on the role that they want to take on.

For businesses that are interested in getting involved, the Selkirk Fair Trade Committee provides information about how to become a Fair Trade workplace.

Vanessa Figus, Manager of Citizen Engagement for the City of Selkirk said that the City of Selkirk itself became a Fair Trade workplace.

"The City of Selkirk offices are all Fair Trade workplaces and all we had

to do is make sure that the coffee, tea, and sugar we have available to staff is Fair Trade and then we got our designation. It's something so simple as something that most of us consume on a daily basis and just making that small switch," she said.

Lamirande explained that this outreach is part of growing Fair Trade in our city.

"To keep your designation as a Fair Trade town, you have to have a certain amount of businesses in town

that are Fair Trade workplaces," said Lamirande.

For residents who aren't able to take on a volunteer role but want to contribute to our community's Fair Trade impact, they can support Fair Trade products being sold by local businesses.

Residents may not even know that there are so many Fair Trade options in our communities or that they may already be purchasing Fair Trade options without even noticing it. For

instance, many of the local grocery stores have Fair Trade items that may have a small logo on the back but otherwise, you would never know are certified Fair Trade from looking at them. A list of some of the businesses in the city and their Fair Trade products is viewable on the city's website.

The City of Selkirk itself is also promoting Fair Trade this month on their website. Until the end of the month, residents can purchase Fair Trade items at the Civic Office or online at the City's website for 50 per cent off.

"We have Fair Trade canvas bags, Fair Trade soccer balls and a Fair Trade book in which Selkirk is featured," said Figus.

community and to help ensure Canadians never forget.

Bird says that in the past the hospital, nursing homes and others have all received funding. A recent project that has helped out the Legion has been upgrades to their washrooms to ensure that they are all accessible.

"Our next project coming up that we're going to be doing is making sure that all the doors [have push button door openers] upstairs and downstairs to make everything more accessible," said Bird.

He says that these changes are important in our community as people get older.

"Our population is aging and you get more and more [people with disabilities], not only the Veterans, but anybody that wants to attend stuff. It makes it easier for people," said Bird.

He believes that it just makes sense that so many people in our community continue to support this campaign year after year.

"Anything that can support anybody that protected our freedoms and our system of government should be looked after, as best as you can, without anybody really coming in and twisting your arm to do it. This should be automatic," said Bird.

Bird thanks residents who have supported the poppy campaign over the years and hopes that they will continue to support it this year.

"I'm very proud of Selkirk and the surrounding community. They support us very well. I've got no complaints with the support that's been happening over the years since I've been doing it and that's five or six years now," said Bird.

 - The Community Spirit Award was presented to Aaron's NO-FRILLS Selkirk.
 - The Customer Service Award rolled its way home to Styling's RV LTD.
 - The Inclusive Business Award was presented to Safeway Selkirk.
 - The Business of the Year Award was bestowed upon Iron Image Barbell Club.

The first ten awards went off without a hitch but the board members of the Selkirk Biz had one last trick up their sleeves. In 2012 when the Biz Awards started, the awards ceremony only recognized four local businesses and as Mitchell said in his opening, the Biz is always looking to add more recognition where it feels it's needed. This year the Biz decided that a Community Impact Award of Distinction needed to be added to the roster.

"At the end of [the Selkirk Biz board making the tough decisions about who will take home these awards], we said that there really needs to be one more award that acknowledges

an organization that really impacts our community in a big way. We live in a community where we've got the Selkirk Mental Health Center, we've got CMHA (the Canadian Mental Health Association), we've got Turning Leaf, we've got Inclusion Selkirk and we've got Hearthstone. It's just a real melting pot of help for people's mental health. And so, there was a decision made to make another award. The Community Impact Award of Distinction is a special recognition given to individuals and organizations that have made an extraordinary difference in their communities. It highlights their exceptional dedication to social responsibility and their efforts to create a positive lasting impact. The recipient of this award is chosen based on the outstanding contributions to the betterment of our community through initiatives such as charitable work, volunteerism, and philanthropy or initiative programs that address pressing social issues. This award is a testament to their commitment to making the world a better place and we're the benefactors of that. They inspire others to follow in their footsteps by engaging actively in the community and building a better place on behalf of Selkirk Biz and the committee that works so hard to make sure that the choices that were made were the correct choices. This special award is going to Inclusion Selkirk," said Mitchell.

This award seems especially apt as October is Disability Employment Awareness Month and Inclusion Selkirk does a great deal of work connecting businesses and employees in our community.

This Biz Awards evening was an engaging community event, but if you missed out on attending, there is still more coming from the Selkirk Biz this year. Catfish Den takes place this evening at 6 p.m. at Lord Selkirk Regional Comprehensive Secondary School. 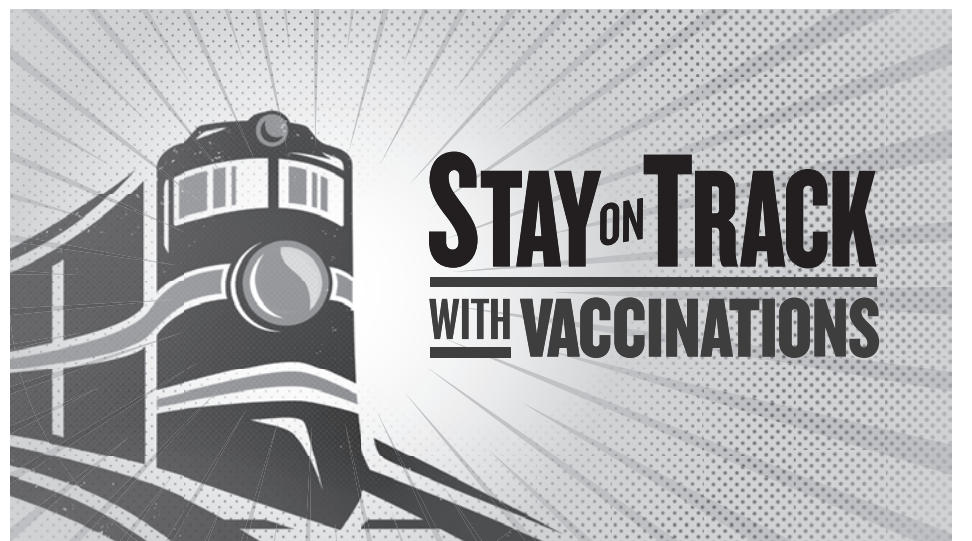

He welcomes residents to come to the gallery this month.

"It's an incredible show we have on right now. It represents all kinds of mediums. It represents all kinds of styles. From realism, there's abstract there is impressionistic and there's something there for everybody," said Dumanski.

Kathy George Moore

George Moore's art primarily depicts the beauty of nature and wildlife.

Her work is mostly made using acrylic paint, however, she has started to experiment with alcohol ink as well and has a few pieces in the gallery this month.

She says that the inspiration for her artwork comes from beauty.

"[I find inspiration] in nature, and online pictures, looking at geography. I like to see the beauty around me," she said.

She loves colour and, like the other artists this month, incorporates contrast and colour to great effect in her work.

Judy Sutton

Sutton is a fabric artist who creates unique personified pieces. They may look like children's toys but if you take the time to examine them you realize how intricate, detailed and joyful the pieces are. She's also an acrylic painter with a representational style.

"I have been primarily a wildlife painter. But I'm moving to more landscapes and figurative painting," said Sutton.

Creating like this gives her joy.

"I love colour and I look for colour and rhythm wherever I am. This has been the most incredible fall for the colour," said Sutton.

The inspiration for her quirky people fabric pieces are the people that she knows.

"A lot of my first people were aging women with the fallacies that follow along with us. So, they're not meant to be particularly beautiful. They just remind you of someone that you know," said Sutton.

She began her art journey after she retired as a music teacher.

"I began with a watercolour painter, my in-

More Canadians report their current and expected debt situation as deteriorating.

An increasing number report a decline in their capacity to handle an interest rate increase (28%, +5pts) or an additional \$130 in interest payments (37%, +5pts).

Half report that they are \$200 away or less from not being able to meet all of their financial obligations (51%, -1pt).

CALGARY, Alberta, Oct. 18, 2023 (GLOBE NEWSWIRE) -- From near-zero to the highest interest rates in over two decades, Canadians' debt outlook has reached the most pessimistic point since tracking began five years ago, according to the latest MNP Consumer Debt Index. Reflecting on their current debt situation compared to one year ago, more rate their current situation as much worse, an increase of 2 points from the previous quarter (20%) and more say their debt situation has worsened compared to five years ago, (25%, +3pts). When asked to look into the future, more believe their debt situation will be worse a year from now (18%, +3pts). Five years from now, more believe that their debt situation will worsen (16%, +2pts) and fewer feel it will improve (35%, -2pts).

"There is no mystery as to what is causing Canadians' bleak debt outlook: it's getting increasingly difficult to make ends meet," says Grant Bazian, president of MNP LTD, the country's largest insolvency firm. "Facing a combination of rising debt carrying costs, living expenses and concern over the potential for continued interest rate and price hikes, many Canadians are stretched uncomfortably close to broke."

More than half (51%, -1pt) of Canadians

report that they are \$200 away or less from not being able to meet all their financial obligations, including three in 10 (31%, -4pts) who say they already don't make enough to cover their bills and debt payments. The average amount of money that Canadians say they have left over at the end of the month dropped significantly this quarter to \$674, down \$97 from the previous quarter, as the surging cost of living has chipped away at household budgets.

When it comes to the potential for future interest rate increases, Canadians feel worse about their ability to absorb further hikes compared to last quarter. More (28%, +5pts) say their ability to deal with an increase of 1 percentage point has worsened. This question was rephrased to ask their ability to absorb an additional \$130 in interest payments on debt, to which four in 10 (37%, +5pts) say their ability to absorb this increase is much worse.

While Canadians' debt outlook and ability to absorb additional interest rates have deteriorated, there were a few bright spots in the data. Overall, the MNP Consumer Debt Index improved slightly to 86 points, up 3 points since last quarter, but remains below the five-year average. Canadians are feeling marginally better about their ability to pay their debts (62%, -4pts), being in financial trouble (60%, -3pts), or being driven towards bankruptcy (45%, -5pts). Four in ten Canadians regret or are concerned about their current level of debt but, perhaps adjusting to the higher interest rate environment, the number who have regrets (45%, -7pts), or feel concerned (45%, -3pts) declined this quarter.

"For now, the financial concerns of some Canadians have been offset, at least to some degree, by the strong job market. The uncomfortable truth is that higher interest rates slowing the economy will inevitably come with consequences like increased

unemployment," says Bazian.

Four in ten Canadians worry about someone in their household potentially losing their job (38%, -2pts), according to the survey.

Bazian says that higher unemployment and underemployment, where individuals either make insufficient income or are given insufficient hours to meet their household expenses, is one of the leading causes of insolvency.

"Bills and debt obligations and the ever-increasing cost of living may be somewhat manageable when income remains consistent but suddenly become troublesome when the unexpected occurs, even after cutting back on non-essential spending," he says.

"That's when the danger of relying on credit to meet basic household needs becomes a real risk. Initially, households use credit with the idea that the reduced income is temporary and that they will be able to pay off the debt as soon as their circumstances improve. Using credit to pay for one bill, then another they start to miss payments and end up on a high-interest debt treadmill," he explains.

The consequences of missed payments, compounding interest, repossession or foreclosure can be swift and have long-lasting effects. Bazian recommends those who anticipate missing payments first contact their lender to see if they can set up a payment plan and seek advice from a Licensed Insolvency Trustee.

Steelers lose home game to Blizzard

The Selkirk Steelers lost 5-2 to the OCN Blizzard at the Recreation Complex last Friday.

OCN grabbed a 2-0 first-period lead on goals by Ashton Gallagher and Marlen Edwards and then went up 4-0 after 40 minutes when Brett Ward and Gallagher tallied.

"It's not the way you want to start any game," Steelers' head coach Hudson Friesen said. "It was unfortunate because I thought we started the first 12, 15 minutes of the first period with a lot of energy and we got our fore-check going and had a lot of opportunities. We didn't capitalize on our chances and they came down and capitalized on theirs from the few mistakes that we made and they got us behind the eight-ball pretty early. It was hard for us to recover after that."

Selkirk, though, made the game interesting with goals from Ethan Brown and Coltyn Chrysler (power play) late in the third period but OCN's Adam Belzil closed out the scoring at 18:47.

With the loss, Selkirk's record dropped to 2-7-1. That's not how the

Steelers wanted to start this season.

"It's definitely not," Friesen agreed. "It's been a bit of an inconsistent first 10 games for us. A few of those losses were tight games but overall we're not overly thrilled with our consistency for our group from game to game. That's something we have to figure out here and hopefully we get on track this week with three games coming up."

A big part of that losing record is Selkirk's lack of goal scoring. The Steelers have scored a league-low 16 goals.

"When you break it down, that's our biggest issue. Defensively and goaltending have been pretty good to give us a chance to win every night," Friesen said. "Now, for us, we need to have guys fill the net and start producing more. When we start doing that, you're going to see more wins piling up for us."

On Monday evening, the Steelers played the Swan Valley Stampede at the Seven Oaks Sportsplex as part of the MJHL Showcase.

No score was available at press time. Selkirk will battle the Waywaysee-

Sarah Ekosky a double gold-medal winner at Manitoba Open Judo Championships

Judo Manitoba hosted the second annual Manitoba Open Judo Championships on Oct. 14-15, 2023.

The tournament featured 360 entries from across Canada competing at the Dakota Community Centre in Winnipeg for two days of exciting judo competition.

The Manitoba Open is the first stop on this season's Canadian judo circuit of major national tournaments. Competitors in the U16 and older divisions competed not only for medals, but also for ranking points to earn selection to the Elite 8 National Championships held in January and for selection to international events.

The home province led the way in the medal standings with a haul of 19 gold, 18 silver and nine bronze medals.

Saturday featured a Kata competition (demonstration of a predetermined series of techniques), a Newaza (groundwork) competition, as well as competition in the U10, U12, U18, U21 and Veteran age divisions. The event concluded on Sunday with competition in the U14, U16 and Senior age divisions.

Also at the tournament, a presentation was made to two prominent local judoka. Long-time coach, referee and builder Henry Fast and 1984 Olympic bronze medalist and former Manitoba head coach Mark Berger were presented with their grading diplomas after recently being awarded their eighth dan (level) black belts by the Judo Canada Grading Committee. Judo Manitoba congratulates Mr. Fast and Mr. Berger on this outstanding lifetime achievement.

The Manitoba Open drew many top fighters, including a number of talented local athletes. Leading the way for Team Manitoba was Sarah Ekosky, a 19 year old black belt, who was a double gold medalist. On Saturday, Ekosky, who trains with the Selkirk Judo Club, won four straight matches to reach the top spot on the podium in U21 Female under 63 kg.

On Sunday, Ekosky, the No. 3 ranked fighter in the country in her weight division, won gold in the Senior Women under 63 kg division after defeating Sara-Anne Beaudin from Quebec in the final.

Two of Ekosky's siblings also won medals at the tournament. Damien Ekosky, a 24 year old black belt, was back in competition after a one-year absence. Damien won gold in Senior Men under 73 kg, defeating Malakai Kurpuweit from Alberta in the final by ippon (full point). Meanwhile, younger brother Daniel Ekosky won a bronze medal in U21 Men under 81 kg.

Shogun Laczko, a 22 year old black belt, finished first in Senior Men under 81 kg. After two wins in the preliminary rounds, Laczko defeated Armin Bondar from Saskatchewan in the gold-medal final to earn the gold medal.

Nicolas Villa, a 17 year old provincial team member who was coming off a bronze medal performance at the Pan Am/Oceania Judo Championships held in Calgary in early September, earned a silver medal for Manitoba in the U21 under 73 kg division. Villa reached the gold-medal final, dropping the final match to Louis-Maxime Dube from Quebec.

Also medaling for Manitoba in the U21 and Senior age divisions were Monica Laqui Ortiz (bronze in U21 Female under 63 kg) and Charlie Launder (bronze in Senior Men under 73 kg).

Manitoba was also well represented in the Kata competition, with local judoka Sonia Christ and Gary Robinson winning silver in the Ju No Kata event.

"This was an important event for our local competitors," said Manitoba provincial coach Airton Nakamura. "Our athletes had a chance to gain

valuable experience against fighters from across Canada without having to travel out of province. The team took advantage of the opportunity and we are pleased with the team's effort and performance this weekend."

"We were able to deliver another excellent event this year," said Milton Good, president of Judo Manitoba, noting that the tournament expanded by approximately 100 entries over last year's inaugural event. "We are grateful to all of the athletes, referees, coaches and volunteers that made this event a success."

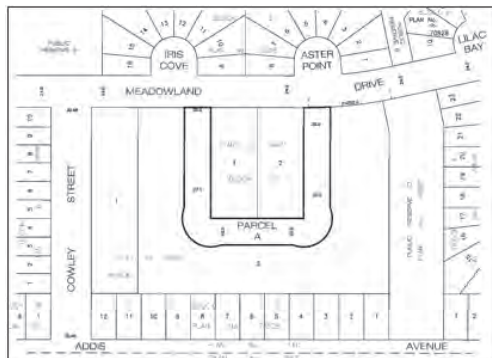

- Cash option of \$16,912.41 per parcel, or
- Finance option of \$1,693.83 per parcel to be levied annually for 20 years.
