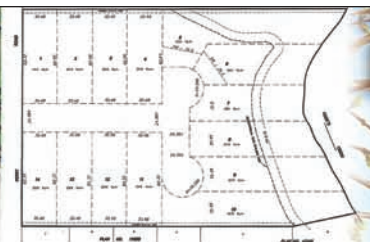

# Confusion surrounds costly St. Andrews wastewater project

Fueled by anger and confusion, some St. Andrews residents are banding together to try and put a stop to a costly wastewater sewer system project they feel hasn't been properly planned or explored.

The opposition to the system comes at a critical time for both the southern portion of the RM and its residents in roughly 900 homes that make up Phase 2 of the operation. Each phase represents a geographical section that is affected.

Part 1 of Phase 2 includes the construction of low-pressure lines throughout the Phase 2 area. Part 2 includes the construction of a regional wastewater force main from River Road to Donald Road and a lift station

and odour control system at Donald Road.

Phase 2 of the system, which if all goes according to the RM's plan would be completed by 2018, will install the collection system and connect St. Andrews to the North End Water Pollution Control Centre in Winnipeg via the Main Street Trunk Sewer in West St. Paul.

"Property owners in Phase 2 will be required to physically connect existing residences and businesses to the wastewater sewer within five years of completion of the system," according to a statement on the RM's website. "With system completion anticipated in 2018, that would mean a required connection time in 2023."

The total estimated cost of the project, according to the RM, is \$15,600,000, with funding of \$4.5 million coming from Canada/Manitoba's New Building Canada Plan's Small Communities Fund, \$2.75 million coming from the Manitoba Water Services Board and a contribution from the RM of St. Andrews Gas Tax Reserve of just over \$1 million.

The current phase requires approval from the municipal board before it can be tendered, but it's now facing stiff objection from residents, including Tom Watson.

Watson says his main concern is cost. As a resident living in the affected area, Watson has started his own blog, [whatsupstandrews.com](http://whatsupstandrews.com), as a tool to get information out to those

he feels need to hear it.

"The one-time fee of \$7,390 or the \$618.39 over 20 years ... I suppose that's affordable if those were the only costs. But it's not," Watson said. "The municipality is not being forthcoming whatsoever on what those costs will be. All they have is a few words in a letter saying you'll be responsible for the costs on your property, but they don't give any idea of what those costs might be."

Watson believes costs could soar past \$25,000 for some homeowners.

His blog states that a total worst-case scenario up-front fee could reach \$23,265, while the same scenario over 20 years would rise to \$28,242 with \$16,493 up front.

"From these numbers you can deduct what you don't need to purchase, everyone will be different," Watson's blog post reads. "Any way you want to slice it, this is a lot of money for anyone."

St. Andrews CAO Andrew Weremy doesn't disagree with Watson regarding the high costs. He says he understands Watson's concern as well as resident's concerns that there are no issues with their current septic field.

# Spring cleanup helps beautify Brokenhead Ojibway Nation

Dozens of Sergeant Tommy Prince School students and a group of dedicated volunteers teamed up to collect garbage and recyclables during Brokenhead Ojibway Nation's (BON) annual spring cleanup.

"Since I've moved home, I've been involved every year," said Mary Chartrand, who moved back to her community in 2013. "It feels good because then we know we're cleaning up the environment here and that it's clean."

Chartrand said BON's spring clean up, which was held on May 10 this year, is organized by the community's health centre each year and since she's been involved, she's noticed a lot less garbage in the area.

"I'm really proud of our community and what they've accomplished so far," she said, adding the opening of BON's grocery store and medical clinic has been a huge boost for the community. "I think we have more people from all over coming to the clinic ... and more

people moving back home."

For Dyana Chief and Jessica Cook, who both currently live in Selkirk but work in BON, the spring clean up is a chance for them to help out.

"It's awesome," Cook said with a smile. "It feels like we're actually taking action ... instead of staying in the office."

Volunteers said they picked up a long list of items ranging from clothing to empty water bottles.

"Most people maintain their lawns but the other areas where people don't live (year-long) that garbage just blows throughout the area and gets stuck in the trees," Cook said.

# Local business owners help refugees enter workforce

For some, landing a job at a greenhouse may not seem like a big deal, but for Ache Ramadan, cashing her first pay cheque in Canada is likely something she won't soon forget.

Ache, 48, along with her two sons Yaya, 26, and Habib, 24, are members of a refugee family living in Selkirk who are getting their first taste of what it's like to work in Canada thanks to two local businesses.

Ache is currently working three days a week at Plants Plus Greenhouse in Petersfield, while her sons are working in the kitchen at the Selkirk Golf and Country Club.

"It's been very good," Yaya said with a smile.

He added his mother is also really

enjoying her job at the local greenhouse.

"It's been really good," he said. "It's hard to understand everything like the language but now it's getting good."

Dozens of volunteers from multiple churches make up the Red River Churches Refugee Team (RRCRT), which helped bring the refugee family to Selkirk in July of last year.

Before coming to Canada, the family spent 11 years living in a refugee camp in Sudan.

Yaya is also joined by his wife Zara and their two young children.

Although the family has been taking English language courses since they arrived in Canada, Yaya often speaks on behalf of the family members.

Gary Wilmott, who has owned Plants Plus along with his wife for nearly 18 years, says having Ache join their team has been a great experience for him and the rest of their staff.

"It's been great. It's opened up everyone's world I think," Wilmott said. "It's great to have an extra hand and she's a great worker. She never stops.

"She's just a lovely lady."

Wilmott said having Ache

around has been a very positive experience.

"In our opinion, she's probably brought more to us than we've given to her," he said. "And it makes you appreciate everything that you have."

For Maureen Peterson, who has worked at Plants Plus for nearly 19 years, working alongside Ache has been a life-changing experience.

"She's brought so much I feel to the greenhouse," Peterson said. "As a person who may not be able to speak English, we can communicate so much just by showing and just through our hearts."

Peterson said over the years she's worked with a lot of people, but Ache definitely stands out for her.

"She's just been such an inspiration to everybody here," she said. "It's just beautiful to see the gratefulness.

"I'm just so moved by that."

Don Forfar, chair of the RRCRT, said out of all of the family members, Ache has had the most trouble adjusting to life in Canada but her new job has helped tremendously.

"This job has just been a godsend, she just loves it," Forfar said. "They've never had any jobs."

Since the greenhouse operates on a seasonal basis, Forfar said they hope to secure a new job for Ache in the near future.

# St. Andrews Airport to host Aviation Related Career Fair

Since St. Andrews Airport hosted its first Aviation Related Career Fair in 2010, the number of women in the aviation industry has steadily grown, says the fair's director, Jill Oakes.

"The reason why we're doing this is because less than six per cent of women work in the aviation industry in Canada. And it's not because the industry doesn't want them," says the University of Manitoba professor.

This year's fair at the St. Andrews Airport, located 20 minutes southwest of Selkirk, on Saturday, June 3, hopes to grow the numbers even higher.

The fair's being called "Women Fly 2017," but both men and women are encouraged to attend the free event.

Throughout the day, the fair will give out 1,000 free plane rides and host attractions such as a flight simulator

and presentations from STARS Air Ambulance helicopter pilots. Several food trucks options will also be avail-

able.

Participants can also look forward to hearing keynote speaker, Rosella

Bjornson, the very first women aircraft pilot in all of North-America.

"We're touching on 140 careers at the fair but that's really just the start of it," Oakes said, listing jobs such as meteorologist, air traffic controller and dispatcher to name a few.

The number of female students in Oakes' aviation courses is growing, but she says many women don't consider aviation as a career because they're unaware of just how many jobs are available in the field.

In previous years, the fair has set world records, winning titles like "Most women to fly in the same day on the same aircraft."

"Manitoba has made a difference over the last seven years and now the province has over 25 per cent of women flying on Canadian air carriers," she says.

# Selkirk dance ensemble seeks support for their journey to the Ukraine

"The fundraiser will allow us to give our dancers the best experience pos-

sible while we're in the Ukraine by participating in workshops with local choreographers and travelling to villages," said Romagnoli.

Like many Manitoban socials, pierogis and cabbage rolls will be served. But Journey to the Ukraine will have a bit of a twist — Troyanda will perform five dances throughout the evening.

The social's other unique factor is that it's in collaboration with Winnipeg-based Ukrainian Dance Ensemble, Sopilka, which Troy-

anda is travelling to the Ukraine with.

This particular trip is special for Troyanda for another reason too.

The group had planned a trip to the Ukraine in 2014, but was forced to cancel due to political unrest in the country. Instead Troyanda travelled in Croatia, Hungary and Austria.

# Four teens face charges in Paddlewheel Princess fire

Four local teenagers are facing charges in relation to the blaze that destroyed the Paddlewheel Princess.

Selkirk RCMP say three 17-year-old males, from St. Clements, Lockport and Selkirk, along with a 15-year-old male from Selkirk are all facing arson charges and have been released pending court dates.

Selkirk Fire Department Chief Craig Fiebelkorn previously told the *Record* they were called to a report of a fire on the Paddlewheel Princess where it was docked at the Selkirk Slough north of Selkirk on May 9.

He said the cause of the fire was "believed to be suspicious" and the blaze took nearly two hours to put out because the volunteer crew members had to fight the fire from the safety of the shore.

"We train all the time to deal with stuff like this and we're very fortunate that no one got hurt," he said.

Selkirk RCMP have also arrested a 13-year-old male from Selkirk and are looking for a 12-year-old male in relation to two other fires.

On May 8, at approximately 8:50 p.m., RCMP received a report of a dump truck on fire at a business on Pitts-

burg Avenue. There were no injuries, but there was extensive damage to the truck and to a nearby vehicle.

On May 9, 2017, at approximately 6:10 p.m., RCMP were dispatched to another report of a fire. The canteen at the stadium in Selkirk Park was destroyed. There were no injuries.

RCMP say it was determined that the fires were deliberately set.

The 13-year-old male is charged with three counts of arson for the two vehicles and the canteen. He has been released pending a future court date.

"We take this very seriously," said Selkirk RCMP Staff Sgt. Marc Samson.

"We're very fortunate there were no injuries in these instances, even though there was extensive property damage. Fire is unpredictable and very dangerous – someone could be seriously injured or even lose their life."

RCMP say they are still investigating.

# We Matter Campaign offers support to Indigenous youth

A national multi-media campaign is looking for participants from Manitoba to record video messages, offering support to Indigenous youth across Canada.

The We Matter Campaign was founded in 2016 by brother and sister, Kelvin and Tunchai Redvers from the Northwest Territories. The siblings created a website where Canadians could record short, uplifting video messages to remind Indigenous youth that they matter.

"We felt like we never saw ourselves or our world reflected back to us in the media. You wouldn't always see the positive stories from across the country. The news would only show the negative side" said Kelvin during

a telephone interview with the *Record* from his home in Vancouver, B.C.

Within a month of launching, the campaign reached one million people on social media. The website now features thousands of videos, including messages from Canadian leaders, such as Manitoban politician, Wab Kinew and Prime Minister Justin Trudeau.

"There's a lot of amazing messages and we've started to share that with youth through workshops to provide them with coping tools," Kelvin said, adding that he hopes one day to guide workshops in Manitoba.

In March, the campaign reached out

to Manitobans on Twitter, asking for more locals to upload video messages onto the website, [wemattercampaign.org](http://wemattercampaign.org).

If shooting a video isn't possible, the campaign also invites Manitobans to upload short stories, poems or art work to the website too.

"Sometimes it takes one person in a community to speak out and expand the awareness," Kelvin says, regarding why he thinks the number of submissions from Manitobans is lower than other provinces.

Kelvin says he and his sister have plans to expand the We Matter Campaign even further. One idea it to train

youth throughout Canada to be "Ambassadors of Hope," advocating for Indigenous rights.

Brokenhead Ojibway Nation Chief, Jim Bear says he looks forward to watching some of the campaign videos and hopes to recognize faces of youth from his community.

"I think it's great that this is happening. Abuse can happen in many forms and can even be from gossip or online bullying, which all leads to suicide," he said.

The effects of residential schools continue to be a factor of suicide in his community and Bear says "we need a lot of inner healing."

The road to Breezy Point was somewhere between mushy and slightly awash as I urged old red along searching for our fellow anglers on the Reds' riverbank last week.

A northeast wind had tided the water over its banks onto the road in places and once again gave me the feeling of being by a Louisiana bayou. Not far from the roads' end, I saw a dark pickup with its front wheels almost at the rivers' water with two men in chairs using the truck as a wind-break from the icy breeze. I turned into the rough mud trail toward them as their expressions changed from curiosity to ease when they saw the sign on my door showing I wrote a fishing column.

"It looks like you've had some luck," I called out as I left my truck, seeing a string of goldeye in the water. The men rose and introduced themselves as father and son Jason and Lionel Moorhouse from Winnipeg. They settled back in their chairs watching their rods for a bite as Lionel began a funny cat-and-mouse drama that happened before I pulled up. He was closest to the water by the front fender of the truck and heard the plopping sound of pelicans slapping their beaks together. Lionel leaned forward peeking around the truck to see three pelicans eyeing their catch with great relish. He shooed them away but they came back time after time until the pelicans decided the humans were harmless and went for the fish.

At the same time a seagull flying in from the opposite direction also saw the goldeye and dove in grabbing one. That was a mistake because pelicans just love to beat up on seagulls! They pounced on it pecking it mercilessly. Lionel, in wonder, stood there laughing as the seagull and pelicans continued their fight out to the middle of the river-without a fish.

Days later I learned of another man,

Richard Bjarnason of Gimli, who had similar experiences. I was on Gimli's commercial fisherman's pier and noticed a kindly faced, white haired fisher arranging some equipment in his skiff. Soon he straightened up and walked from the floating dock to the pier clad in rubber boots, loose dark pants, and a gray hunter's shirt. He stopped in front of me, a fishing rod in his hand, his legs spread born of years of keeping balance in a skiff riding the mountainous waves of Lake Winnipeg. He caught my perplexed look at the fishing rod, "you know many of us commercial fishers like to sport fish when we can," he offered.

We exchanged names and fishing stories where upon I mentioned the Moorhouses' experience. Richard laughed recalling when he was out on the lake lifting nets he would toss a fish to the birds and heaven help the seagull who got the fish first when pelicans were around. They would gang up on the seagull literally picking it up in their beaks trying to tear it apart if it didn't give up the fish.

It was still, hazy and cool last Friday as I slowly walked along the stony beach south of Grand Marais to its

beautiful hidden lagoon. The soft sand smelled of marine life. To the north, a rocky water break sheltered a lone angler in a chair holding an extremely long fishing rod wearing an old hoodie and cut offs. I strode leisurely along the beach until I came abreast of him and trying not to disturb the peaceful atmosphere asked, "any luck?" He tensed sitting upright shaken from his solitude then gave me a greeting smile saying, "no, lots of bites but nothing yet." "Hi I'm Arnie Weidl, I write a fishing column." "I know you," he remarked as he shook my hand, "we talked last year about my tournament angling efforts, I'm Rory Jones."

"You know," he uttered, casting a sideways glance at the glass smooth lagoon water, "I've been fishing these waters for 50 years and it's still full of every kind of fish imaginable." We talked more for a while then as I walked back up the beach I turned looking at Rory half laying in his chair face to the sun and I felt what he felt, the pure relaxed joy of being an outdoors person.

## Road improvement projects among highlights of St. Andrews budget

Continued funding for public works highlighted the RM of St. Andrews 2017 financial plan but the biggest boon for St. Andrews Mayor George Pike is that the budget itself didn't increase.

"In the three years this council has been involved, the budget has only increased by 1.6 per cent," Pike said, adding the municipal mill rate has not increased in 2017 and council approved their financial plan was approved on May 9. "That's a big factor for the people. And we're still maintaining our projects, including putting more money into our wastewater reserve and also for the Petersfield lagoon."

Funding for road improvements came in at \$2.4 million, with \$500,000 allocated to gravel, \$450,000 set aside for dust control and the remaining \$1.5 million for road maintenance and construction.

Full depth repairs will also be made to parts of Clandeboye Road, Chesley Crescent, Hall Road and Donald Road.

In the drainage and ditch opening department, \$200,000 is being set aside for improvements. Additional funds will be used as needed out of the Drainage Reserve to address and remedy poor drainage areas.

The total public works and transportation budget for 2017 is just over \$5.1 million.

Expenditures are up by just over \$300,000 from the 2016 budget and \$815,000 over actual 2016 expenditures, with the number just shy of \$14 million in the 2017 financial plan. An added

\$125,000 to roadwork and equipment operations, \$130,000 to drainage and \$150,000 to the RMs three fire departments are among the areas getting a fund boost.

Backup power supply units at all three fire halls will be purchased. The South Fire Hall will receive upgrades to its ventilation system and reverse osmosis system. Two heaters will be replaced at the Matlock Fire Hall, in addition.

Council also pointed out that the increase in spending in 2017 is being partially funded by surpluses allocated through the reserve funds and spending decreases in areas such as larviciding, recycling and audit fees.

The RM had a roughly \$800,000 surplus in 2016. The total reserve fund sits at \$6.1 million.

A presentation on May 9 also noted that the RM does not currently have any debt, but that will change with the commencement of the South St. Andrews Wastewater Collection Project, with construction getting underway in a month's time.

The RM has purchased a new excavator to replace their 12-year-old unit, which Pike said was having some "hiccups." A large grass cutter was also bought to help tend to the ditches in the area.

Money has been set aside to improve the RM's administrative offices, including improving the main washrooms to better accommodate those with physical disabilities. The building itself will also receive improvements on its second level, bringing it up to code.

## RM of West St. Paul applies for financial plan extension

The RM of West St. Paul could not complete their 2017 financial plan until it received the final cost amounts of each Local Improvement District (LID) from the province's Manitoba Water Services Board, which arrived at the RM on May 3.

The RM has applied for an extension of their financial plan from the May 15 deadline to June 30 to allow the proper LID process to take place in Riverdale, Lister Rapids, River

Springs and Rivercrest.

Letters will be sent to residents in the LIDs, offering a one-time opportunity to prepay for the improvement. Residents will have 30 days from the time the letter is sent out to decide.

Once municipal administration knows who will be prepaying and who will be financing, amended borrowing bylaws will come before council for first reading the week of June 12, 2017.

# Volunteers look to raise \$5K for Sandy Hook Community Centre

After their first successful GoFundMe campaign last year, Sandy Hook Community Centre (SHCC) is bringing it back again in an effort to help keep one of the community's important pillars up and running.

The community centre is looking to raise \$5,000 for further improvements to the aging building, which was built in 1972.

Last year, their inaugural campaign raised more than \$8,500 after having set the same \$5,000 goal.

The funds allowed for an overhaul of the front of the building, bringing with it reframing, new windows and other structural work. Additionally, an accessibility ramp was added and upgrades to the building's plumbing were addressed.

"Last year was our maiden voyage with it," said SHCC board member Art Zuke. "We do annual fundraising for the community club and I brought forth the idea of maybe doing this and it was very successful."

"We were able to do a lot of things that needed doing."

This year, the new funds will go toward a bevy of new projects that need a financial hand.

The plan, if the money is raised, is to replace their old, rotten shed with a bigger one. Their children's programs

would also see a boost with the purchase of new outdoor play equipment, which would be stored in the fancy new shed.

Replacement of the east community deck, electrical upgrades and ongoing structural improvements would also be addressed.

"We do three big community pancake breakfasts during the year and we're really juggling the electrical to make those happen," Zuke said.

The history of the SHCC dates back to 1919, claiming to be Manitoba's

oldest and longest running volunteer-based and owned community club. The original community centre was built in 1928, but had to be replaced in 1972 due to lake corrosion.

The seasonal building sees near non-stop action during the summer months and provides "robust seasonal programming for children, families, and adults. It is an active hub of community engagement through which

community spirit is built and life-long friendships are forged and nurtured," according to its GoFundMe page.

Zuke is a life-long Sandy Hook resident and has visited the community centre since he can remember, as have his kids.

"I grew up in that building," he said. "I grew up at the day camps. As a teenager I worked there and in my 20s I volunteered there and now as a parent, I've seen my children move up through the day camp and they're volunteering now."

"I've spent my whole life there, in one way or another. And now as a board member, I continue to work there on a volunteer basis to keep it going so that those in the community have the same opportunities I did."

Zuke said that the SHCC is a great community meeting place.

"In many ways, it's an equalizer that brings together people from all walks of life and socio-economic circumstances," he said. "Personally, I've made life-long friendships out there."

As of Monday afternoon, the GoFundMe had raised \$650 of its \$5,000 goal.

# Learning how to forgive

## Woman 'struggling' to move on after brutal attack at Selkirk rehab centre

Nearly a year after two youth support workers were brutally attacked at a former Selkirk rehabilitation centre, one of the victims is trying to forgive those responsible and move on.

"I don't want to hold hate in my heart," said Jackie Healey, who attended the 17-year-old's sentencing hearing on May 10. "I don't want to hold a grudge. It's not good to hold one."

"I want to forgive, but it has to be individually."

The teen, who cannot be named under the Youth Criminal Justice Act, is one of the three youths responsible for the vicious beating of the then 23-year-old, leaving her blind in one eye.

The youth was sentenced to 30 months (20 months in jail followed by 10 months of community supervision with credit for 344 days of time served), just days before the one-year anniversary of the attack.

Healey, a Red River College practicum student, was nearing the end of her final shift at the Selkirk Behavioural Health Foundation (SBHF) on May 29, 2016 when a second youth approached Healey and her supervisor with a metal bat and a sock filled with pool balls. Both were beaten and the two teens robbed Healey of her keys and got away in her truck. A third teen was involved with the planning, but was not present during the attack.

The two teens who have yet to be sentenced have pleaded guilty.

For Healey, the sentencing on May 10 was the beginning stage of the closure she says she needs.

"I didn't have to be (at the sentencing) but I chose to be there. I thought it would give me a chance to heal," she said. "I'm glad I went. I went in there with anger."

"I was confused how to feel."

The teen also apologized to Healey during his chance to address the courtroom.

"I didn't go in there expecting that," she said. "He was always a really quiet individual."

"I didn't expect him to stand up in front of everyone to apologize."

As for the other two involved, Healey says she wants to see signs of remorse, especially from the teen who carried out the brutal assault.

"That's going to be the hardest one," she said. "Everyone had a good relationship (with her attacker at the

SBHF). I need to hear why (they did it)."

The horrific attack has left Healey dealing with the effects of post-traumatic stress disorder and severe depression.

"I thought I knew what depression was before this," she said. "It's a whole new thing to me. It's crazy. I have my bad days. The PTSD ... loud noises, that startles me. People yelling, it scares me."

After Healey's hospital stay, she was confined to a dark room for weeks as she recovered from the concussion sustained in the attack.

"I just didn't do anything, I just laid

in bed," she said. "I laid in the dark for like two months. The concussion and my eyes, the sunlight. I was nauseous. I just didn't have the energy to get up and go anywhere."

"That was horrible."

Although Healey has since returned to school, she says it's been hard.

"It put me back," she said. "I'm struggling right now."

But she says giving up isn't an option.

"I want to try," she said. "I feel like I need to move forward. I don't want to just give up. I've been like that the whole time because it's so easy to give

up. I've pushed myself a lot to keep going forward. I think that was hard in the beginning, I pushed too hard. But it will all work out, I'm hoping."

# Red ribbons honouring MMIW removed from bridges

'The ribbons were ripped off the railings,' Selkirk woman says

A Selkirk woman says a "recent disrespectful act" shows the lack of understanding within the community surrounding the reasons why red ribbons are tied to railings along bridges across Canada.

"As Aboriginal people, it's a personal way to acknowledge our missing and murdered indigenous women and girls," Jeanie Red Eagle said. "Some of those who are commemorated lived in the Interlake area."

"The visual cue speaks to the heart that our loved ones' lives were/are significant."

Red Eagle was among a group of local and area residents who tied long pieces of red fabric to the Highway 4 bridge in April. She said they were recently removed after the province received a complaint about them. She

added she has confirmed with Selkirk MLA Alan Lagimodiere that a complaint about the ribbons had been filed, which later led to their removal.

Red ribbons tied to the Selkirk Bridge were also "ripped off the railings and tossed along the roadside and pathway of the bridge" last week, she said.

"My first response upon hearing the news was to tend to the ribbons strewn about so as to give due respect," she added. "I don't want families to feel any more additional unnecessary pain."

"Red ribbons, red clothes and dresses, white crosses and wreaths are also placed to encourage healing of families and communities impacted by lost loved ones."

Red Eagle says the red ribbon awareness campaign speaks to her on a deep and personal level after her mother was murdered several years ago. She added purple ribbons have now been tied to the Selkirk Bridge and she plans to tie red ribbons to the Highway 4 bridge in the near future.

# City of Selkirk unveils 2017 waterfront concert series

Summer nights in the City of Selkirk are due to warm up very soon with the launch of the 2017 Waterfront Concert Series.

Also appearing will be hometown product Aaron Starr who thundered into the music scene at the age of 16, wowing crowds and performing live

for almost a decade.

A fireworks display will follow to close out the day.

The Multicultural Extravaganza takes the stage on Saturday, July 22. The annual celebration of diversity and inclusion features Sich, a high-energy, Winnipeg-based group specializing in Ukrainian and other ethnic music.

On August 12, Rock the Waterfront returns to the city with a pair of classic rock tribute bands to two legendary artists. Bed of Roses, considered by some to be the world's best Jon Bon Jovi tribute band, headlines the evening with a show that traces the history of the rocker from the start of his storied career in the 1980s to present day. Sharing the bill will be Travellin' Band, a tribute group for Creedence Clearwater Revival, one of the most popular bands of the 1970s whose music and appeal resonates among fans new and old to this day.

The 2017 series draws to a close with the Waterfront Festival on Saturday, August 26. Headliners for this event will be the B-Side Champs with a rhythm and blues revue.

## Watermelon Protein Bites



Recipe courtesy of Anya Shinall of Anya's Eats

- 1 cup pitted dates, soaked purified water
- 1 1/2 cups sprouted watermelon seeds, divided, plus additional for garnish
- 1 tablespoon coconut butter
- 1 cup fresh watermelon, chopped
- 1/8-1/4 cup roughly chopped beets (optional)

Chop dates in half.

Place dates in bowl of purified water and soak 1-2 hours.

Remove dates from water bowl and place them into food processor. Pulse a few times then add 1 cup watermelon seeds, coconut butter and watermelon.

Add chopped beets, if using. Blend until well combined, scraping sides of food processor as you go. Add remaining watermelon seeds and pulse, leaving some seeds chunky. For smoother texture, continue to blend.

Remove mixture from food processor, place in small bowl and cover, allowing to cool in refrigerator 30 minutes.

Remove mixture from fridge. With fingertips slightly wet, roll mixture into balls and place on a plate. Once done rolling, add watermelon seeds to top.

Place watermelon bites in freezer 1-2 hours, or until frozen.

## Steel-Cut Oats with Watermelon

Servings: 2

- 1 cup 1 percent milk, plus additional (optional)
- 1 cup water
- 1/2 cup steel-cut oats
- 3/4 cup diced seedless watermelon
- 2 tablespoons dried tart cherries or cranberries
- 2 tablespoons chopped pecans

- 2 tablespoons maple syrup

In medium saucepan over high heat, bring 1 cup milk and water to gentle boil. Pour in oats. Stir; return to gentle boil then reduce heat to simmer, stirring occasionally, 20-30 minutes.

While oats are cooking, in small bowl, combine watermelon, dried fruit, nuts and maple syrup. Portion out oats and top with watermelon mixture. Add additional milk, if desired.

The Selkirk Steelers won the ANAVET Cup back in 2007 after a wild Game 7 quadruple overtime victory over Humboldt in front a boisterous – and jam-packed – crowd at the Rec Complex.

# Royals' baseball season ends before KPAC final

The Selkirk Royals' baseball team had a tough task last week.

Selkirk pretty much had to win out in its final four games to earn a spot in this week's KPAC final.

And the Royals were only able to win one of those games, whipping Murdoch Mackay 19-2 last Thursday. In Selkirk's other game Thursday, the Royals were defeated 14-5 by Springfield.

The Royals started the week May 16 with losses to Kildonan East (8-2) and River East (7-0). Selkirk, obviously, had trouble scoring runs in both five-inning games, especially against the Kodiaks.

"Against KE on Tuesday, we were back and forth with them a little bit," said Royals' assistant coach/manager

Trevor Churchill. "They'd score and we'd score but we definitely had trouble scoring runs."

As much trouble as Selkirk had on offence, they also had some problems on defence. The Royals committed way too many errors to give themselves a real chance to win.

"We had a lot of throwing errors," Churchill recalled. "And we had a lot of infield grounders that we couldn't (get the out) at first. There were some mental mistakes there."

Last Thursday, a lot more runs were scored compared to Tuesday as teams had to battle a fierce wind that created havoc – and plenty of uncertainty – with fly balls.

"The wind was an issue for us to catch the ball," Churchill insisted.

Against Murdoch Mackay, Selkirk

took advantage of an inexperienced pitching staff to score the 19 runs. The Royals scored the maximum seven runs in an inning on two different occasions.

"We hit the ball better," Churchill said. "The bats were there...but the pitching was a lot different than against River East and KE."

Throughout most of this past season, Selkirk struggled to put key hits together at important times in a game. That cost them in many games and resulted in a much poorer overall record than many expected.

"In the first seven games, including exhibition and tournament play and the first week of league play, we had 50 strikeouts in seven games," Churchill noted. "That's a lot of strikeouts and you're not going to score runs when

you are striking out."

Churchill, meanwhile, would like to stay on with the Royals' baseball coaching staff next year – and in future years – with the goal of building a successful baseball program at the Comp.

"Coaches and staff have rotated through the team and I'll be at the high school until I probably retire, so I would like to continue on and bring some stability," he said. Hopefully, staying on would allow me to build a program and get some tournaments going and stuff.

"My goal is to stay on and do what I can to build a program and, hopefully, put a competitive team on the field every year."

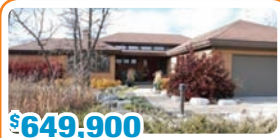

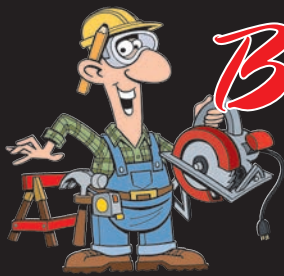
